- Has served in the Wake Forest community for more than 50 years.
- Is an all-volunteer nonprofit organization.
- Is dedicated to the betterment of the community in the social, cultural, civic and educational life of individuals.
- Is a member of the international General Federation of Women's Clubs.
- Divides its work into six service areas the Arts, Conservation, Education, Home Life, International Outreach and Public Issues.
- In 1961, sponsored the establishment of the Wake Forest Public Library as its first major project. In 1973, club members led the raising of matching funds toward the purchase of the Central Carolina Bank building to provide more space for the Wake Forest Public Library.
- Was an original sponsor and actively participated in the restoration of the Calvin Jones House, Birthplace of Wake Forest College, and still supports the Wake Forest Historical Museum.
- Organized one of the first Senior Citizens Clubs in Wake Forest.
- Has supported and provided renovation and gifts to the Wake Forest Community House and town parks.
